River Foss Nature Walk/ Amble/Ramble

Saturday 21st September 2024 after 9am to 4pm.

As part of the York Environment Weeks' celebrations, we invite you to explore nature along the path beside the River Foss between Strensall and Haxby.

The walk starts on the Foss bank in Strensall behind the Ship Inn YO32 5XS and ends at The Landings in Haxby YO32 2SJ. The Ship Inn is opposite the Methodist Church.

You can do the whole trip or walk just as far as you want. You don't have to do the whole journey. You could also do the walk down the Foss to Towthorpe Bridge, then return to Strensall on the other side. This sometimes gets overgrown, though, so be careful.

- 5. Can you see any birds, animals or mini beasts? Can you find out any interesting facts about them? Are they native species?
- 6. Can you find out what differences there are between a dragonfly and a damselfly?
- 7. Use some of your other senses what can you hear, see, touch or smell?
- 8. At the end, write down or draw what's your favourite thing on your walk today?
